

YOUNG LIVING RELIEF EFFORTS

We all have a part to play in the fight against COVID-19, and as the world leader in essential oils, Young Living is dedicated to our mission of health and wellness now more than ever. One of the ways we're stepping up to this challenging time is by partnering with several non-profit organizations to help those in need. These are some of the actions we've taken recently to contribute to COVID-19 relief.

- Young Living has donated \$292,198 of in-kind product to the Baby2Baby network of family resource centers, homeless shelters, health clinics, and head start centers across the US. We helped fulfill needs for baby essentials, personal care items, healthy snacks, and other items needed.
- A second round of food, baby, and personal hygiene items was donated to Baby2Baby. These essential items will serve families in communities hit hardest by COVID-19 restrictions and store closings.
- We donated over 400 pounds of food to the Utah Food Bank after we temporarily closed our on-site cafe.
- We offered the use of our corporate buildings in Lehi to the Utah Department of Health as hospital overflow.
- Young Living employees sewed 2,000 fabric masks for use by employees in our Spanish Fork warehouse and additional masks were donated to community organizations.
- The D. Gary Young, Young Living Foundation donated 1,728 boxes of Gary's True Grit® Einkorn Flakes Cereal to The Cereal Project, which were distributed via the Jordan Education Foundation Central Principals Pantry to aid local schoolchildren and families.
- We donated 500 packs of our Seedlings® Baby Wipes to the Silicon Slopes Serves organization to aid their short supply. This donation was sent to One Utah Child Care programs.
- YL donated over 6,000 personal care and food items to The Rescue Mission of Salt Lake to help fight hunger and homelessness in Salt Lake City during COVID-19.
- Young Living donated \$55,000 to the Tracy Aviary which helped operations and fed birds while gates were closed due to COVID-19.
- Young Living donated 1 percent of all North American proceeds from the Thieves® product line through the month of March 2020 to Meals on Wheels. The total donation, \$233,767, was given directly to the Meals on Wheels COVID-19 Response Fund.
- Young Living has been donating hand sanitizer from our Thieves® line to help combat the COVID-19 health crisis. Donations have been going to the frontlines of the pandemic, including fire and police departments, school districts, health care workers, and other vital support areas. The company will continue to make products available to these organizations until demand due to COVID-19 has subsided.
 - Donations include 1,250 bottles of Thieves Waterless Hand Sanitizer to the Salt Lake Education Foundation for teachers and staff, 650 bottles of Thieves Waterless Hand Sanitizer to Utah Refugee Connection to help support the staff and families of refugees that URC serves, and 800 bottles of Thieves Waterless Hand Sanitizer to the Utah Department of Corrections to help support the health the officers onsite as well as protect the safety of inmates.
 - Young Living donated 500 bottles of Thieves Hand Sanitizer to Salvation Army of Salt Lake City to help support the vulnerable communities they serve, and 50 bottles of Thieves Hand Sanitizer to Sunrise Preschool for teachers and staff.

- Young Living donated over 2,000 bottles of Thieves Waterless Hand Sanitizer to Utah institutions including Urban Food Connections of Utah, Granite Education Foundation, Alpine Education Foundation, Peace House Inc., and Community Action Services and Food Bank.
- Young Living Europe supported hospitals and care homes across Europe with €50,000 in products, including 12,000 lip balms, 2,800 Genesis Hand & Body Lotions, Lavender Hand & Body Lotion, and 3,000 Slique Bars.
- The D. Gary Young, Young Living Foundation has donated over 4,200 rolls of toilet paper to Utah Refugee Connection, Christian Center of Park City, SLC COVID-19 Mutual Aid, Volunteers of America Utah, Utah Aids Foundation Food Pantry, Salt Lake Education Foundation, and The INN Between.
 - The Foundation has also donated 579 rolls of toilet paper, 4,655 bottles of Thieves Spray, and 1,344 bottles of Thieves Hand Soap to Tabitha's Way North Pantry in American Fork.
- Young Living donated 2,000 healthy snacks and food items to healthcare workers working extended shifts at Utah Valley Hospital. Products include Slique Bars, Pure Protein Complete, blender bottles, Protein Bites, and Zyng.
- Young Living Philippines donated PHP 339,832 (approx. USD \$6,711) to the Philippine Red Cross COVID-19 Response Fund, which was a combination of donations from members as well as Young Living. These funds helped meet immediate needs for healthcare, food, water, and sanitation. Funds will also be used to support longer-term education and recovery in affected regions.
- The D. Gary Young, Young Living Foundation donated 1,788 backpacks to Salt Lake Education Foundation which will help them package food donations for families in need.
- Donated 20,000 empty 10 oz bottles and 115,000 2 oz bottles to state organizations to help package drums of hand sanitizer received from distilleries, which were then distributed to frontline workers.
- The D. Gary Young, Young Living Foundation donated approximately 11,000 pairs of NingXia-branded socks to The Road Home and Community Action Provo.
- Young Living donated personal hygiene items and hand sanitizer to The Volunteers of America in Utah. This donation will provide aid to vulnerable individuals and populations who struggle with homelessness, addiction, and mental illness in our Wasatch Front communities.
- Donated various products including shampoo, conditioner, soap, deodorant, and toothpaste to The Road Home. This donation will help assist individuals and families experiencing homelessness in Salt Lake County and along the Wasatch Front.
- Young Living has donated \$81,596 in products to the Navajo Nation Tribe which was used to deliver water, food and essential cleaning and hygiene items to the local to chapter houses of Kaibito, Leupp, and Chilchinbito in Arizona, and Navajo Mountain in Utah.
- While schools were closed in Ecuador, Young Living Academy staff delivered groceries to the families of its 210 students, which helped to replace the meals students normally received when school was in session.
- Donated Thieves Waterless Hand Sanitizer and Seedlings Baby Wipes to The Children's Center to support their reopening after COVID-19. The Children's Center provides comprehensive mental health care to enhance the emotional well-being of infants, toddlers, preschoolers, and their families.
- Young Living donated various essential oils and bar soaps for the residents at The INN Between facility. The INN Between houses individuals who are terminally ill and have no other housing resources, providing a safe and COVID-free home where they can receive all their basic needs, 24/7 caregiver support and access to professional hospice care.
- N95 masks, hand sanitizer, diffusers, and essential oils were given to Encircle to support their reopening of houses across Utah. Encircle offers programs and services for LGBTQ+ individuals in an environment where they can thrive. Using community, connection, and affordable therapy, Encircle teaches individuals to love themselves and empowers families.

- Our sponsorship with the University of Utah has provided us with the opportunity to donate Young Living gift packages to frontline workers who were past members of the University of Utah Spirit Squad.
- Young Living has donated \$40,000 in essential oils to major New York City hospitals in collaboration with Urban Zen and their Integrated Therapy program, which helped benefit doctors, nurses and other frontline workers inside hospitals.
- Young Living Employees made 3D printed masks which were donated to the Utah County Sheriff's department.
- Young Living South Africa raised R80,000 (approx. US \$4,500) to assist the food budget of the Orlando Children's Home, an organization which offers curative and preventative services to deal with problems of abandonment, neglect, and abuse of children.
- Member Services donated their leftover breakroom food from to the D, Gary Young, Young Living Foundation. It was then donated to the Utah Tribal COVID-19 Relief Fund and Millcreek City and will benefit the Navajo Nation. It included 396 toilet paper rolls, 3 cases of NingXia Red, and assorted snacks.
- Young Living donated hand soap, diffusers, and over 400 essential oils to The Hale Centre Theatre to help prepare for their reopening. Our essential oils will be added to their hand sanitizer and as aromatherapy around the building.
- We donated socks, personal hygiene items, and 500 bottles of Thieves Waterless Hand Sanitizer to the YWCA of Utah to help them continue to serve over 225 residents each night throughout the COVID-19 pandemic.
- Donated 870 water bottles to the Granite Education Foundation to help ensure all students have access to drinking water throughout the school day while drinking fountains are turned off due to COVID.
